Outdoor Area Survey

Thank you to all the students, parents and staff that contributed to the outdoor area survey last week. The findings were discussed at last weeks P&C meeting. Key findings were;

- OVAL—increased shade, seating and infrastructure for sports and games
- COLA—keep clean and maintain area, improve seating
- TOP PLAYGROUND—Investigate long term resurfacing plans and start to plan for project as a long term goal, keep netball and basketball zones
- TOP K-2 YELLOW FENCE PLAYGROUND—replace shade cloth, fix equipment and make into learning space

The school will prioritise and investigate costed options for these areas. We look forward to seeing the improvements in both the short and long term.

Lockdown Practice at school

Last week we practiced our school Lockdown procedures. Given the wet weather, we decided not to follow the Evacuation procedures. This has been rescheduled for Tuesday 26 June at 10.40am. The students and staff did a fantastic job in the Lockdown procedures and are to be commended for remaining calm and focussed.

Mindfulness Program

The mindfulness program is well on its way this term. Students in Years 1 to 4 have been actively involved in this program and have enjoyed exploring a positive mindset. Research has shown that mindfulness has been shown to improve empathy or the ability to understand what another person is thinking or feeling, which improves student's awareness of others and helps them to build positive relationships.

This term students have been focusing on tuning in to internal and external experiences by building on their self-awareness, social awareness, and self-confidence. The program aims to support students to develop the ability to self-regulate their emotions, especially difficult emotions such as fear and anger, through breathing and other grounding techniques. Students have been working on building their resilience as they have learnt skills to help them manage stress, as well as engage more fully with themselves and the world. It is great to see students using the techniques they have learnt in this program throughout their school day!

On Wednesday 27th and Thursday 28th of June (week 9), we would like to invite parents to come and join in on the fun! You can come along and participate with your child or you could pop in to see how we practice mindfulness.

Athletics Carnival

The 2018 Maroubra Bay Athletics Carnival will once again be held at Hensley Athletics Field on Wednesday, 20th June.

Notes have been distributed to the students and must be signed and returned to your child's teacher by Monday, 18th June to allow students to get on the bus. Due to the hire of venue, equipment and bus transport there is a cost of \$10 for all students.

Years 3-6 will depart from school at 9:15am and return to school at approximately 2:30pm while K-2 will depart at 10:00am and will hopefully be back at school during lunch.

All K-2 students will compete in amended track events and participate in various novelty activities from 10:20am – 1:00pm. The K-2 carnival is predominantly focused on participation and skill building and all students who enter an event will receive acknowledgement of participation. K-2 events will run in conjunction to the primary students in the centre grassed area of the venue. Parents are encouraged to join the students on the middle of the venue however, please be aware the venue does not allow prams to be brought on to the grassed area.

Those students who finish in the top 3 places of their age group in the 3-6 carnival (top 4 in the 100m) will represent Maroubra Bay at the Eastern Suburbs Zone Carnival.

Please see the order of events table to gauge a time to when your child will be competing in each event. Please be aware that these times are only approximate and there may be slight changes as the day progresses.

Please note that due to the venue only having one discuss facility, the 8 – 9 years discuss event will be run at school after the carnival date.
