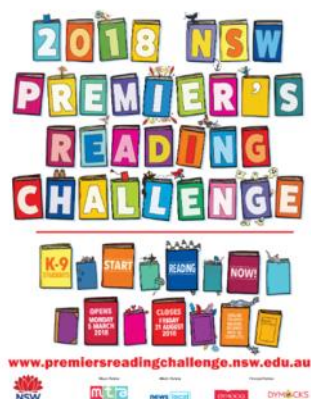

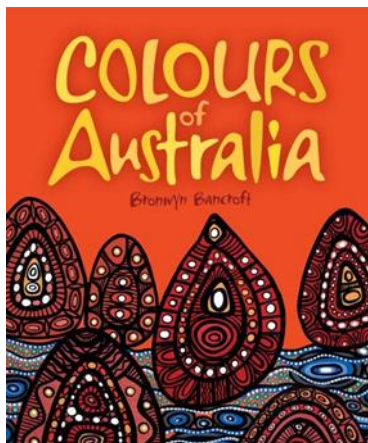

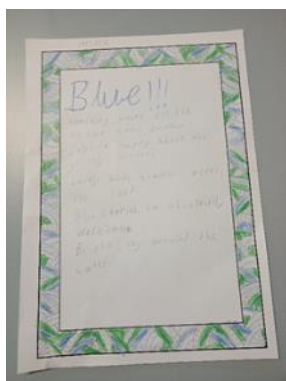
FOCUS On 2C

As part of the fantastic NAIDOC celebrations 2C explored **Colours of Australia** by Bronwyn Bancroft, a collection of short poems Aboriginal dot paintings depicting the colours of Australia's unique landscapes. Students drew inspiration from the world around them and employed their literacy skills to create original poems that 'Painted a Picture' with their words. The results were fantastic!

S.T.E.M. Challenge

Students also used their Mathematical knowledge, problem solving and cooperation skills to complete a fun and challenging S.T.E.M. (Science, Technology, Engineering & Maths) task. In groups they had to plan, design, construct the tallest free-standing tower using only 8 pieces of recycled paper and 2 lengths of tape.

"We tried twisting the paper and making tubes to try and make our tower more stable. We didn't win the tallest but we did have the most stable tower." – Maeya



"My group started with base that was like layers. We made a flat tube shape and put lots of paper inside inside it to try and make it stronger. We had to try lots of different ways of making the tower because it kept falling over." – Nat
