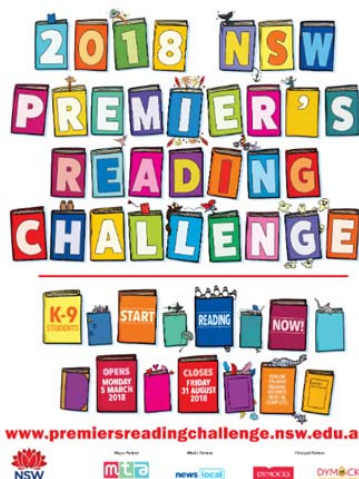
Book Covering Bee

Number Crunchers

Last term, Stage 3 competed in the Number Crunchers. There are three competition; Number Crunchers, Rubik's Cube and Pi. Stage 3 competed in five rounds of the Number Crunchers, where they had to answer 20 difficult mathematics questions within 10 minutes. It was a close competition with Samuel and Alex winning the competition. Next was the Rubik's competition. Toby smashed the competition, as he was the fastest person to solve the cube. Finally, we had our Pi competition; students had to recite the decimal places of pi and with no recurring pattern, this was another tricky competition. The competition was very close as Cooper won by just five decimal places.

On Wednesday the 15 August, our Champions went to Maroubra Junction Public School to participate in the 2018 Number Crunchers Regional Competition. They all went very well. Samuel came 4th in his heat and Alex came 3rd. It was so close. Toby came 3rd, solving the Rubik's Cube in 53.7 seconds, missing 2nd place by 0.6 seconds. Cooper recited 56 places of Pi, the winner reciting 589. No one made it to the finals, but it was a very fun day.

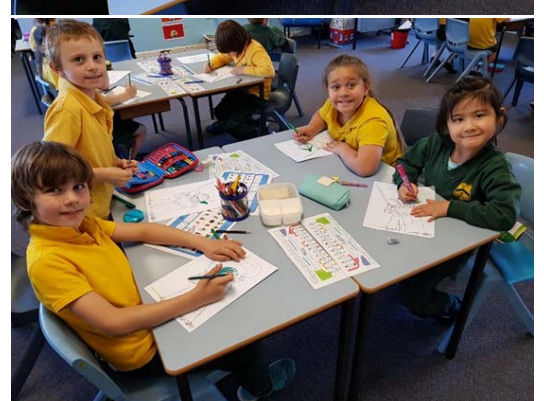
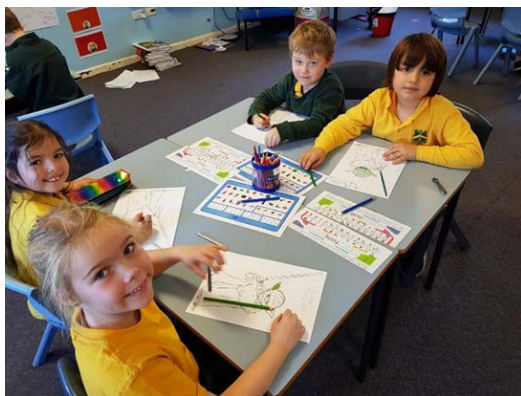
