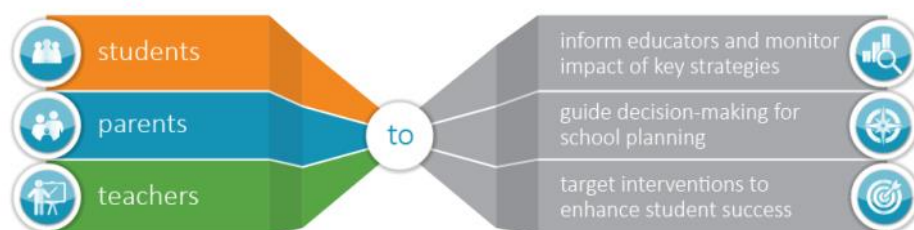

SRC Newsletter report

This term in SRC two initiative we have had were the lost property buckets and Fiver for a Farmer. We started SRC in term 2. To be an effective SRC, we first wanted everybody to felt comfortable to have their say in our meetings and feel comfortable with everybody else. To do so we played a number of social games and bonding activities. We also had a number of discussions on what the role of the SRC is and created a contract to ensure everyone is doing their part.

Our next step was thinking about our school; what can we do to make our school a better place? Many ideas came up but only three stood out to everybody. 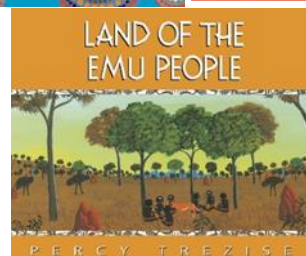
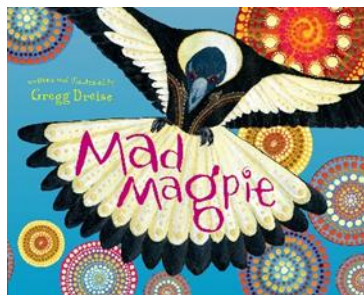
Aboriginal Books in the Library



We have a section in our library dedicated to our wonderful selection of Aboriginal books. Books written by Aboriginal authors include Bronwyn Bancroft, Percy Trezise, Greg Dreise, and Jess Black to name a few. We also have an informative series called The History of the First Australians.

An extensive research project was conducted over several years to compile the content for this series. Australia's First Peoples came about 50,000 years ago. The arrival in places at different times led to distinct cultural unique groups of peoples. The topics covered in this series include the First Peoples response in terms of hunting and gathering differed based on climates, food supplies, and skills. The spread of the peoples and the extended period of settlement led to complex kinships structures, oral histories, dance and belief systems which were unique for each of these tribes.

The series was written to be read by early and intermediate stages of Grades 1-3 and can be used as content by fluent readers. There are twenty books in this series and they are available for borrowing. Encourage your child to borrow from this section to build their knowledge on Aboriginal people.

We must always remember that under the concrete and asphalt of our schools this land is and always will be traditional Aboriginal land.



Aunty Lee

Welcome to Aunty Lee Timbery as Aboriginal SLSO at Maroubra Bay Public School.

Aunty Lee is now at the school to support Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Students from Monday to Thursday in achieving their educational goals as well supporting parents and carers in the local Koori community. It is great to have Aunty Lee here to help our kids and support staff in implementing Aboriginal Cultural programs such as an Aboriginal dance group, Dreamtime yarns and guide our kids in the identifying their connection to country and totem. Young Mob Program

Connection to culture is an important factor in the health, social and emotional wellbeing of Indigenous youth. The Young Mob Program helps connect Indigenous youth to their culture and empowers them to develop and grow their leadership and life skills.

More than one third of Indigenous students currently do not complete Year 12. The Young Mob Program helps students to engage in their education and development, creating a brighter future for themselves. The Young Mob Program will target Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children from grade 4-6. Please keep your eye out for the permission slip or come in and see Aunty Lee for more information.

Deadly Kids Awards.

Congratulations to Jayquan D in Year 4S, a proud recipient of the 2018 Deadly Kids Doing Well Award. The 10th annual Deadly Kids Awards Ceremony was recently held at The Great Hall Building at the University of Technology, Sydney. This award is an acknowledgement of Jayquan's efforts and achievements at school. The term 'deadly' in Aboriginal English, means: doing well, achieving and / or talented.

Jayquan was supported by the attendance of his family and Mr McGuinness at the awards. Well done Jayquan we are all very proud.



Personalised Learning Pathways

Effective PLPs are based on relationships and engage parents and carers.

Personalised Learning Pathways (PLPs) map the pathway that a student needs to follow to achieve learning goals. PLPs describe a clear destination for the student in terms of goals for learning. They identify the potential obstacles that might impede a student getting to their goals, and chart a course through them.

In essence, teachers, in conjunction with students, parents/family and other support people, construct a PLP for a student by answering four key questions:

1. Where is the student now?
2. Where should the student be?
3. How will they get to where they should be?
4. How will we know when they get there?

Over the next few weeks a letter will come home or your child's class teacher or Aunty Lee will call, to make a time to come in and have a yarn about what is important to you and your child as goals in this Learning Pathway.

Staff Professional Learning

On Monday 10 September, all staff completed the cultural awareness training led by the Aboriginal Education and Wellbeing advisors. This was a very informative and beneficial 3 hour session informing staff of Australian and local history, the importance of Personal Learning Pathways for all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students, as well as the importance of developing positive relationships with all our families in our community. A very worthwhile session and we thank Anthony Galluzzo and his team for leading us in this learning.



Year 3

This term, our topic has been **AUSTRALIA**.

We have been focussing on this topic in many different areas of our learning.

In art we have been studying Australian artists Ken Done and Albert Namatjira and created art works in their style, focussing on **COLOUR** and **SHAPE**.

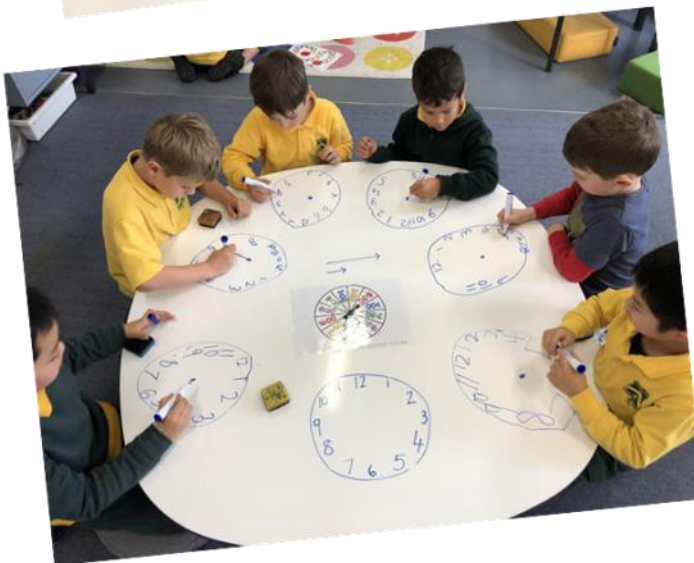
Kindergarten

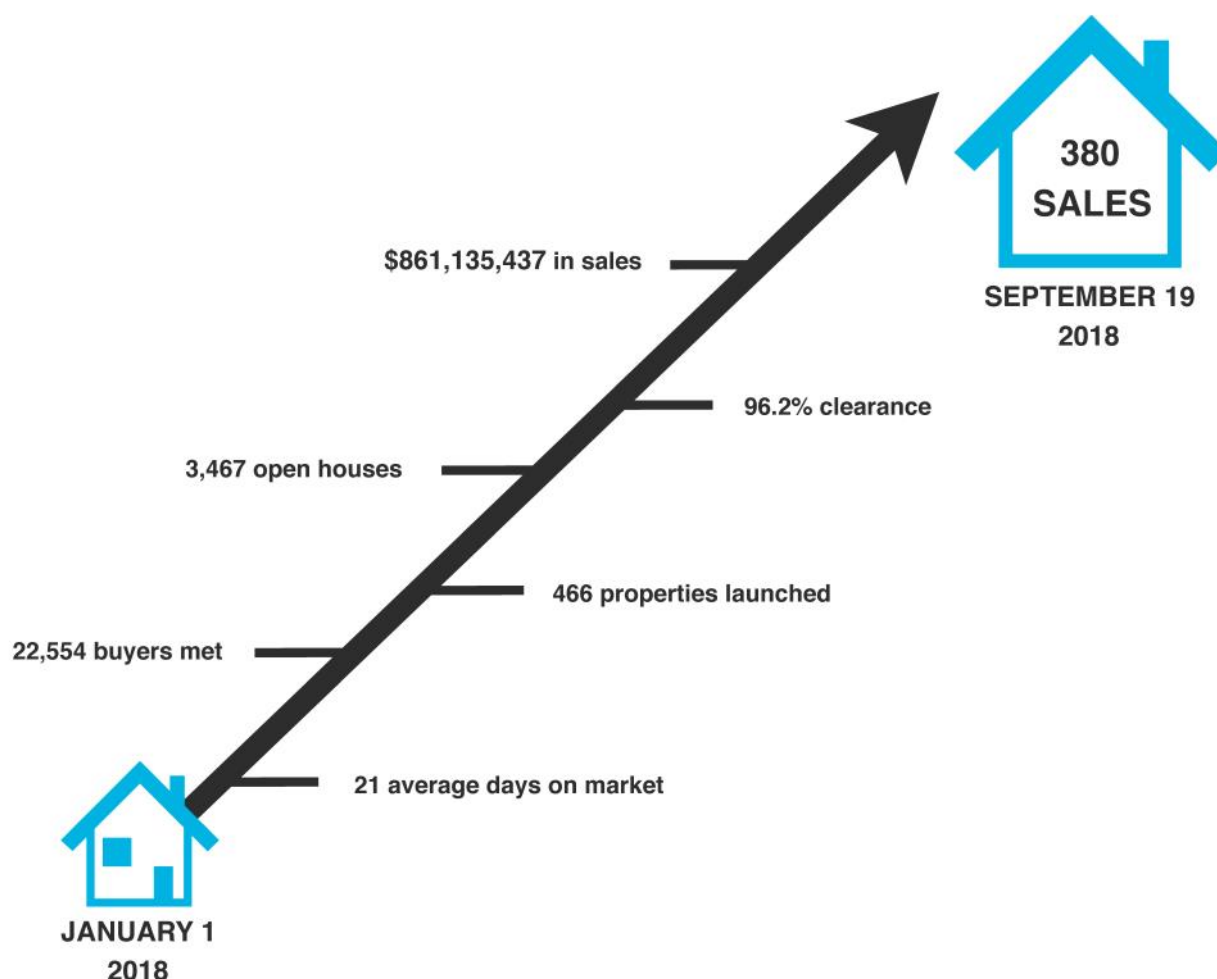
