## Peer Support

Next term, we will be utilising the Peer Support Australia Program to organise Peer Support at Maroubra Bay Public School. For almost 50 years, Peer Support Australia has supported schools across the nation to positively impact student wellbeing. The main purpose of the program is to provide our school community with an evidence based, peer led approach to enhance the mental, social and emotional wellbeing of young people. This program aims to provide students with social and emotional knowledge and skills, whilst also further developing leadership skills for our Stage 3 students.

Year 6 students will be our Peer Support Leaders with Year 5 also being involved as helpers. In Term 2, they will complete Peer Support Training, organise, implement and reflect on Peer Support sessions and take ownership of their leadership role. Students will be implementing 30 minute sessions to smaller groups of students from K-4. The sessions will be centred on relationships and aligns well with many aspects of the curriculum.

It is very exciting to have such a fantastic program at our school.



## Visible Learning Parent Session

Next Wednesday 3 April at 6pm, Miss Mapps will be hosting parents with an information session on Visible Learning. This is one of our 3 Strategic Directions in the school and Miss Mapps will be talking about why it is important and what is happening in every classroom.

## South Sydney Enrichment Program

This term, 4 students from Year 6, Nyssa P, Tuliomanu N, Cooper d S and Avier A, were chosen to participate in the South Sydney Enrichment Program. Every Wednesday, we have participated in this program and have enjoyed many aspects including learning about the brain, playing chess, doing drama, learning about film and having a medieval day. We have been working with students from other schools such as Pagewood, Daceyville and Maroubra Junction. Because of this program, we have started to develop close friendships with them. Here are some of our favourite experiences:

In week 1, we used drama games to get to know one another. Miss Aine gave us different scenarios like two aliens met and they said "hello" but in their own way, she then asked us to demonstrate with a partner from another school. It was hilarious taking on the persona of an alien. We also played a class favourite "Zap." This game is about speed. You need to avoid being 'zapped.' Standing in a circle, if someone points to you, you must duck and the people either side of you are pinned against each other. The first person to 'zap' the other player continues the round, the person 'zapped' is out. The winner is the last person standing.

In week 4, we had a professional come in to teach us about chess. We learned about the different pieces and he taught us different ways that we could win. The best part is when we versed others and tried to use his tactics. Then the professional gave us worksheets that had a picture of some tactics and how to capture the opponent's pieces. On this day, we also played giant chess and began thinking about making a film.

In week 5, we had another professional come in, this time with amazing weapons and armour. He chose 5 lucky people to show examples of what it looked like when people wore and used the armour through the different times in history. He also showed us the ways that you could use the weapons. We learned how to use swords, catapults, and a bow and arrow. We witnessed him shoot the arrow and catapult luckily he hadn't missed in 15 years. Later that day we made pikelets with Year 8 students at South Sydney and we got to eat them afterwards. They were delicious!

We have thoroughly enjoyed every part of this program and feel sad that it is coming to an end. There were so many wonderful things that we have learned and people that we have met. We want to thank South Sydney for hosting this fantastic program.

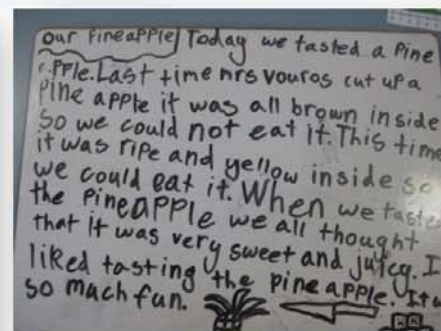
## News from 2V

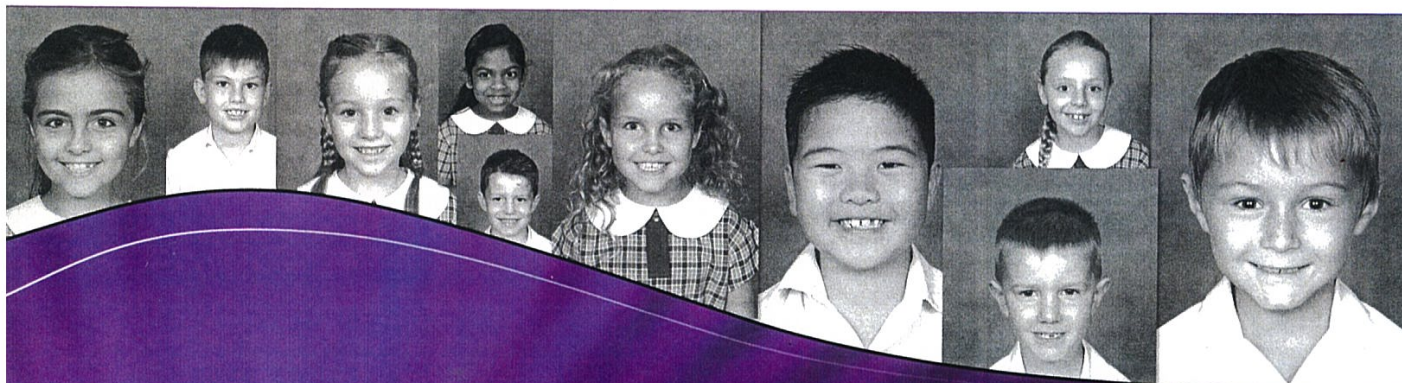


