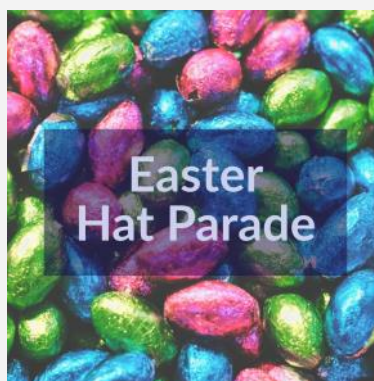
School Photos

DanceSport Challenge 2019

Maroubra Bay Public School has participated in the Public Schools NSW Dancesport Challenge program since 2010.

Year 5, DanceSport Challenge 2019 team will have the opportunity to participate in a 15 week program of ballroom dance tuition, taught by Ms Sherrie, who is a professional dance instructor. The dances taught are Cha Cha, Tango, Salsa and Jive. This exciting program culminates in over 2000 students from public schools in NSW competing at the Gala Night held on 10th September, 2019 at the Sydney Olympic Park Sports Centre.

In addition to learning skills in dance, the Dancesport Challenge program builds confidence levels and fosters the values of respect, cooperation, perseverance and trust.

The DanceSport program for Maroubra bay will begin Term 2 Week 2. More information is provided to all year 5 students.

Great Aussie Bush Camp – Stage 3

In week 4 next term, Stage 3 are going to the Great Aussie Bush camp and we are can't wait. On the 22nd – 24th of May, Stage 3 are heading to Kincumber, which is north of Sydney. The purpose of this camp is for students to develop leadership and team-building skills, as well as to improve their self-awareness and self-esteem. Students will be provided with the opportunity to challenge themselves in a number of unfamiliar situations and achieve personal bests. Activities will include abseiling, archery, giant swing, high ropes, raft building, and rock climbing. We also thank Sofia K, Lily C, Cooper d S and Avier A for assisting in the success of this event.



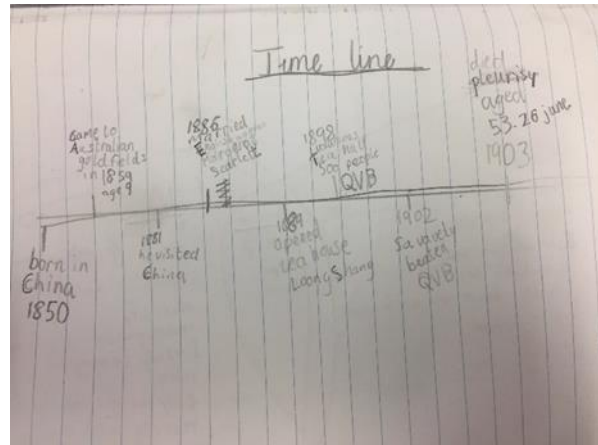
Life in Year 4

We are historians

In history Year 4 have been learning about individuals who have had a significant impact on the Australian community. We have been developing our research skills as well as learning to construct timelines.

In history we have been learning about Quong Tart. Quong Tart was a popular figure in Sydney in the late 19th century. He was a tea merchant from China. In 1889 he opened a tea house called Loong Shang in King Street. In 1898 he opened a luxurious tea hall in the Queen Victoria Building which could fit 500 people. He was a remarkably successful, innovative and fair businessman who treated his employees and customers well. He had a significant impact on the Sydney community in many ways including donating to many charities and organisations and organising free banquets. He was a true celebrity of his time and was farewelled with a huge public funeral when he died.

In term 2, teachers will take back the reins and will be running Monday sport sessions with a focus on fundamental movement skill games and fitness activities.

Our 3-6 students kicked off their shoes in term 1 and ventured down to the beach to take part in beach activities. The change of venue certainly had a positive effect on our students with teachers reporting a vast improvement in participation, effort and most importantly enjoyment in sport for all students who attended. It was also fantastic to see parent involvement this year, assisting with running of activities each week. We look forward again to the warmer months so we can get ourselves back down to the sand.

Finally, our PSSA representatives have had an incredible start to the year with all teams notching up consistent wins throughout the term. I would personally like to congratulate all PSSA students on their effort and sportsmanship shown each week when representing our school in the zone competition. The end of term one now marks the halfway point of the summer season which will be completed in term 4 later in the year.

Moving into term 2, Winter PSSA trials for netball and soccer will take place on Friday week 2. Maroubra Bay will be fielding 2 junior and 2 senior netball teams and 1 junior and 1 senior soccer team. More information regarding winter PSSA trials will be distributed early next term.

Please be aware that limited spots will be available for this program and there will be costs involved. All other school sport students will participate in athletics and cricket skills rotations. Both these programs will be funded by the school with no cost to families.

After such a positive start to the year in sport we are all excited and looking forward to the many opportunities for success offered to our students in the year to come.
