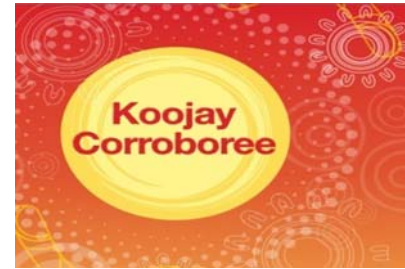

Each year Randwick Council hosts the Koojay Corroboree at Coogee Beach to acknowledge Reconciliation Week and celebrate the local heritage. As most locals know, the name Coogee is from the Dharug language, spoken by the Gadigal and Bidjigal people who inhabited the area. The word, 'koojay' refers to the 'smell of seaweed drying', which washes up on the shores of the beach and leaves a distinctive smell as it dries in the sun. We are so lucky to live in this part of the world and last Friday a group of our Aboriginal students attended the Koojay Corroboree.

Students experienced cultural performances, fire displays, shell art and painting. The highlight of the day was watching our very own Jesse play the didgeridoo and dance.





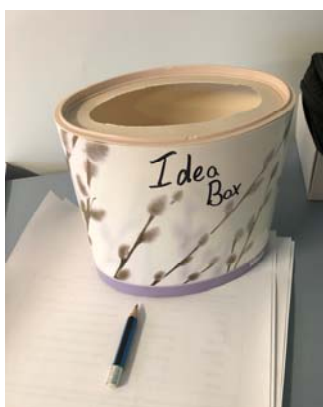
Strategic Directions at Maroubra Bay

Focusing on “Let’s judge a book by its cover” by 2S....

We’ve all heard the saying “Never judge a book by its cover”. That’s exactly what 2S has been practising in responding to literature. Focusing on predicting outcomes as a comprehension tool, through the visual text “Lost and Found” by Oliver Jeffers. We made predictions by combining two things: 1-clues the author leaves for the reader, such as words, pictures or text features and 2- what we already know.

The fun part was when we split into two big groups. We wrote adjectives on our moon whiteboard table and white boards. Some of the many adjectives and nouns we wrote down were ‘sad, lonely, boat, umbrella and snowy’.

Let’s look closer at the penguin’s facial expressions; can you spot his frown through his beak? Can you spot his droopy sad eyes? We believe the main reason the penguin is sad is that he is away from his home; Antarctica. We explored how far Antarctica is from Australia....and it is really far away. No wonder the Penguin was worried in the story!

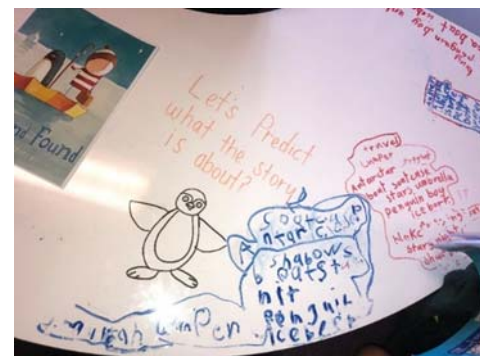

Athletics Carnival 2019

The 2019 Maroubra Bay Athletics Carnival will once again be held at Hensley Athletics Field on Wednesday, 12th June this year.

Notes have been distributed to the students and must be signed and returned to your child's teacher by Friday, 7th June to allow students to get on the bus. Due to the hire of venue, equipment and bus transport there is a cost of \$10 for all students.

Years 3-6 will depart from school at 9:15am and return to school at approximately 3:00pm while K-2 will depart at 10:00am and will back by 2:30pm.

All K-2 students will compete in amended track events and participate in various novelty activities from 10:20am. The K-2 carnival is predominantly focused on participation and skill building and all students who enter an event will receive a sticker for participation. K-2 events will run in conjunction to the primary students in the centre grassed area of the venue. Parents are encouraged to join the students on the middle of the venue however, please be aware the venue does not allow prams to be brought on to the grassed area.

Those students who finish in the top 3 places of their age group in the 3-6 carnival (top 4 in the 100m) will represent Maroubra Bay at the Eastern Suburbs Zone Carnival on the 9th and 16th of August.

Please note that due to increasing numbers in our school, pre-carnival trials will take place at school next week for field events (shot-put, discus, high jump and long jump). After these trials take place, the top 10 qualified students in each age group will compete at Hensley for zone selection. This will ensure that all events are able to be completed on the day.

Finally, if there are any parents who are willing to assist with the running of field events please contact the office or come and see myself or Miss Mitsoulis at school.

We look forward to seeing you all at Hensley Park on the 12th to support our students at this important yearly event.
