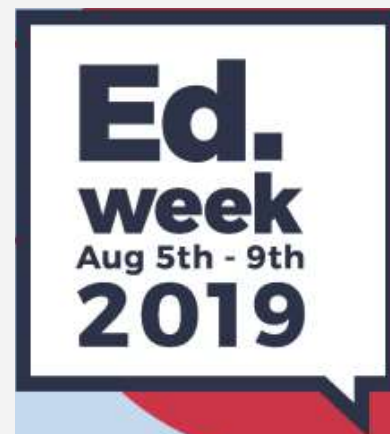

Are you up for the challenge?

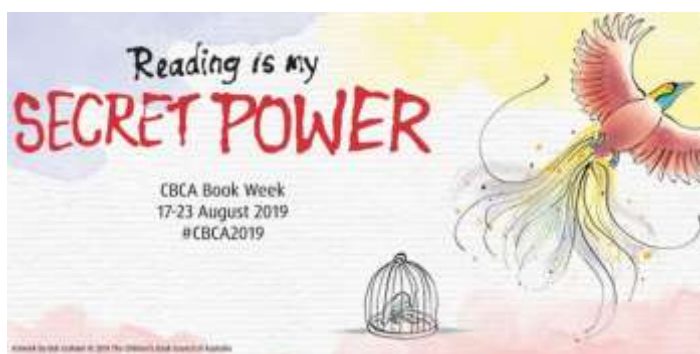
Let's try and reduce the amount of rubbish at MBPS by having a waste free lunchbox.

Book Week

Book Week is approaching (Week 5) and Maroubra Bay has a lot going on.

On Tuesday 20th February, we will have our much celebrated book week parade, where students are encouraged to come to school dressed as a favourite book character. This is always a highly participated event by both students AND staff. Parents are invited to come along to our parade at the hall at 2pm.

On Monday 19th August we will have a visit from the creative team behind the new book **'The Fruit that Loves Itself'**. As this team moves into different classrooms throughout the day, students will learn about illustrating, writing books for a specific audience, and the theme of self-appreciation.

All week there will be a book fair running inside the school. Thanks to Scholastic, we will have a variety of great books on display available for parents to purchase. All books purchased will contribute to us achieving our goal so that proceeds from those purchases come back to the school.

All students have been entered into a competition hosted by Randwick Library. You wake up one morning to find that you are a super hero. Your secret power? Reading! Draw and colour yourself as a super hero (K-2), and explain how would you use your powers as a force for good? (3-6). Entries will be displayed at Randwick and Bowen libraries.

All this term, students are focusing on shortlisted books from the CBCA 2019. The school Library already purchased these books last term shortly after their announcement, and students are now beginning to explore and investigate them in detail.

The Premiers Reading Challenge (PRC) closes August 30th, and all students are continuing reading registered books (or have books read to them by their K-2 class teacher) to reach their reading goal.





In Year 6, students are given more opportunities to take on a leadership role in the school. Students are encouraged to take ownership over their learning and the responsibilities around the school. 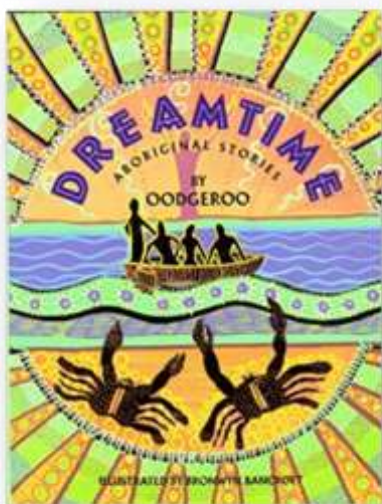
