Figures reveal growing schools

A Mascot Catholic school has the highest number of students per teacher of any school across the eastern suburbs and Sydney City, according to the most up-to-date data from 2018.

An analysis of national data from the Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority has revealed the schools where teachers have the most students to teach. The figures show that in 2018 in the Sydney City and eastern sub-

urbs region there were more students per teacher at St Therese Catholic Primary School in Mascot than any other school. According to the data which includes all state and private schools nationally, the Mascot school had an average of 22.3 students for every teacher.

The next highest ratio of students per teacher was found at Our Lady of the Rosary Catholic Primary School in Kensington (21.9 students per teacher), St Michael's Catholic Primary School in Daceyville (20.9),

St Andrew's Catholic Primary School in Malabar (20), and Bronte Public School (19.4). Coogee Public (19.3)

The (student-teacher) ratio is only marginally different to that of the government sector

Catholic Schools NSW

and Randwick Public (18.9) also featured in the top 10. Despite four of those schools being Catholic

schools, a Catholic Schools NSW spokesman said the ratio was only slightly higher than most public schools.

"The average remains only marginally different from that of the government sector," he said. "Student-teacher ratios are affected by a range of factors ... such as teacher experience, the number of non-teaching staff, school size, and the level of socio-educational advantage of the students. NSW Catholic Schools continue to offer a terrific education, with high-quality teachers and

academic results well above the state average."

In contrast, there was one teacher for every 2.8 students at Central Sydney Intensive English High School, the region's lowest ratio of students per teacher.

Meantime, the data also reveals Maroubra Bay Public School as the fourth fastest growing school in the eastern suburbs and Sydney City region and the fastest growing in the southeast - which its principal Matthew Ackerman has put down to an improved ethos, great teaching

and better communication with parents. Between 2013 and 2018, Maroubra Bay Public School increased by 77.6 per cent from 205 students to 364 students, with the roll expected to reach 410 next year.

Mr Ackerman said when he arrived at the school more than three years ago a new initiative focusing on respect, care and responsibility was being rolled out. "I think that has resonated quite strongly with the children, community and staff."

Would you like to be on national TV? Come down to Heffron Park at 8.20am this Sunday to be in picture for Channel 9's TODAY Show who will be doing a live cross from the Superhero Walk!

On Thursday our school came together for our superhero mufti day and to raise funds for the new playground for the K-2 students. It was great to see so many kids having lots of fun and dressing up as their favourite superhero. The Superhero Walk has so far raised \$13,168 and there's 24 teams committed to joining our superhero dad for a lap around Heffron Park. From 12pm on Saturday, he'll be walking non-stop for 24 hours dressed as 24 different superheroes to make sure we hit our target of \$24,000. You can join him and fellow superheroes on Saturday between 12pm and 5pm and Sunday between 7-12am.

We hope to see you on the weekend as together we make a difference to the kids of our school, one step at a time.

Can I still donate?

Where are the donations going?

100% of all donations go to the Maroubra Bay Public School P&C and to the building of a new playground for the K-6 students.

Will there be media at the event?

Channel 9's TODAY show will be doing a live cross at 7.20am on Sunday 22nd September from the Superhero Walk base. Make sure you're there as your favourite superhero to get on national TV! There may also be other media throughout the event.

Will there be prizes?

Yes. There will be boy and girl prizes for;

- Highest fundraising team
- Best dressed superhero

Where does the Superhero Walk start and finish?

The Superhero Walk base will be located at the amenities block located next to the synthetic soccer field on the Western side of Heffron Park. The superheroes will be walking in a northerly direction along the designated walking track. Please note this is not the cycling track but the walking track as shown in orange below.



Is there parking?

Yes, there is plenty of parking in the adjacent car park.

Are there toilets?

Yes. The Randwick Council amenities are equipped with toilets.

How many laps around Heffron Park will we do each SUPERHERO hour?

Each hour the superheroes will be walking 1 lap around Heffron Park. We'll be walking at a reasonably leisurely pace which should be comfortable for most kids.

How far is 1 lap around Heffron Park?

3.4km

Can we walk more than 1 lap?

Yes! We'd love you to walk as many laps as you like between Saturday 21 September from 12pm – 5pm and Sunday 22 September from 7am – 12pm. Remember there are prizes for the kids who walk the greatest number of laps.

Can I only join the walk at the Superhero Walk base?

No feel free to jump in anywhere on the track.

What's the walking track like?

The Heffron Park walking track is a two-way paved track that is relatively flat except for a small hill on the north side. It's a public track so please be mindful and respectful of others. Recreation bikes are allowed.

Are there any street crossings?

The walking track crosses over the car park entrance where the cricket nets are at Jersey Road, the car park entrance on Bunnerong Road and the car park entrance on Fitzgerald Avenue. Please take extra care to cross these roads carefully and make sure your kids are safe.

Are kids allowed to walk on their own?

All kids are to be supervised by an adult.

Is this a supervised event?

No. Kids are the responsibility of their parents and are not supervised. Do not drop and go!

Can anyone come?

Anyone is welcome to join the Superhero Walk between Saturday 21 September; 12pm – 5pm and Sunday 22 September; 7am – 12pm.

Who is walking with superhero dad Tas throughout the night?

A small team of superheroes will keep Tas going throughout the night and early morning.

WHAT SHOULD I WEAR?

You can come dressed as any superhero you want! Tas will be changing into a new superhero every hour and you're welcome to come dressed as that superhero, any other superhero or your own made up superhero.

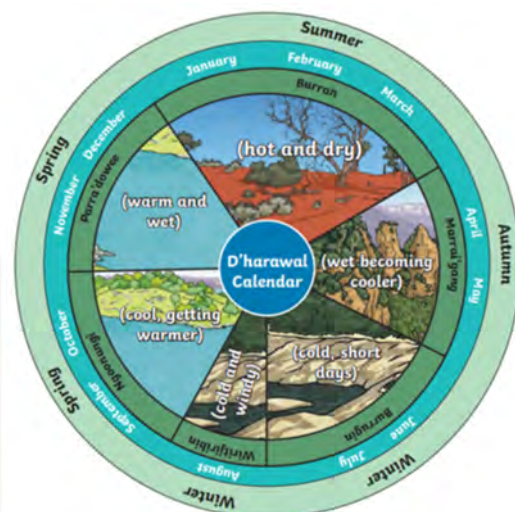

Aboriginal Education at Maroubra Bay



This term, as part of the Geography unit students have been learning about how Aboriginal people classified seasons. Students have been actively involved in conversations surrounding the similarities and differences between our current four season's model and the Aboriginal six season model.

The D'harawal Tribe (also known as the Tharawal Tribe) are based in New South Wales. They have six different seasons in the year and each one relates to the weather changes we see as outlined on the calendar wheel.





Life Education

In week 7, all students had the opportunity to attend a Life Education workshop that explicitly linked with the PDHPE syllabus.

Each stage got to investigate a different learning module using different interactive videos featuring the friendly giraffe, Healthy Harold.

The students thoroughly enjoyed this experience and are now more confident in making safe and healthy choices.





This term, we have been working on a number of different areas. Here are a few of our favourites.

Persuasive Writing

Guess what this is: it has a start, a body made up of three parts, and an end. Give up? It's a persuasive text! In year 6, we have been writing persuasive texts using topics that were given to us. We drew them out of a hat, researched and we had to pick a side to write about. Using our knowledge about the structure of persuasive texts and then useful language features, we created a first draft, then checked where we are on the bump-it up wall. The wall has 4 different persuasive texts and we have to figure out which one we are at and do our best to move up on our second draft. We also used the Success Criteria and marking rubric to ensure we are getting the best marks. After another two drafts, we published our final product on the Chromebooks and send it to Google Classroom. Next time you're writing persuasive text remember that nothing is perfect and you can always improve. It may sound confusing, maybe even daunting or stressful. But year 6 have had so much fun doing it, and you will too!

Art

In 6B, we have learnt a lot about art. We have developed our skills in the elements with a focus on line, shape, space and colour. Our favourite project was creating our masks for the Art Show next week. With inspirations from Chinese dragons or the Rainbow Serpent, we planned and created our masks. We experimented with all types of cardboard from big to small, thick boxes to thin strips, folding and twisting. We ensure that it had layers to make certain areas stick out. Then, we painted our masks to make them pop with colour and used a little bit of gold, silver and black markers to give them a more mystical feel.

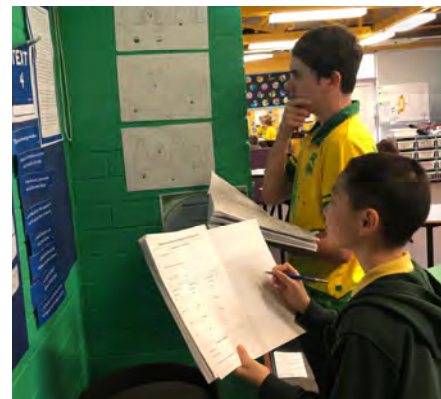

We ensured these faces had all types of shapes, lines and shading to make these faces look as real as possible. It has been a fabulous term of art and we thank Ms Rose for the exciting lessons.

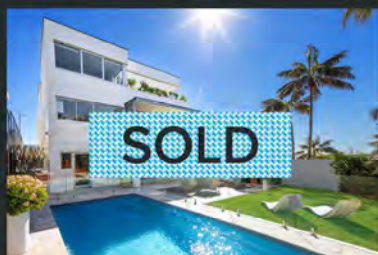
